BCCPAC, a registered non-profit and non-partisan, represents the parents of 565,000 children attending provincial public schools. Recognized by government and education partners, BCCPAC is the collective voice of parents on educational issues within the public system. We strive to foster a culture of acceptance, diversity and inclusion in our public schools and advocate both for systemic changes and individual parent advocacy. BCCPAC is governed by a volunteer board of nine directors elected annually by the membership; our District Parent Advisory Councils (DPAC) membership represents 90% of parents in public education and Parent Advisory Councils (PAC) from 56 districts across the province.
